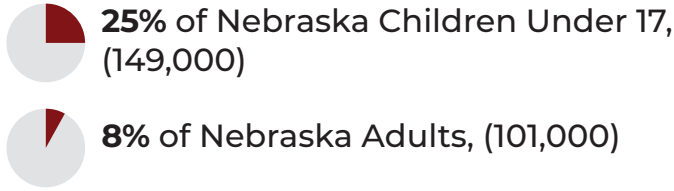

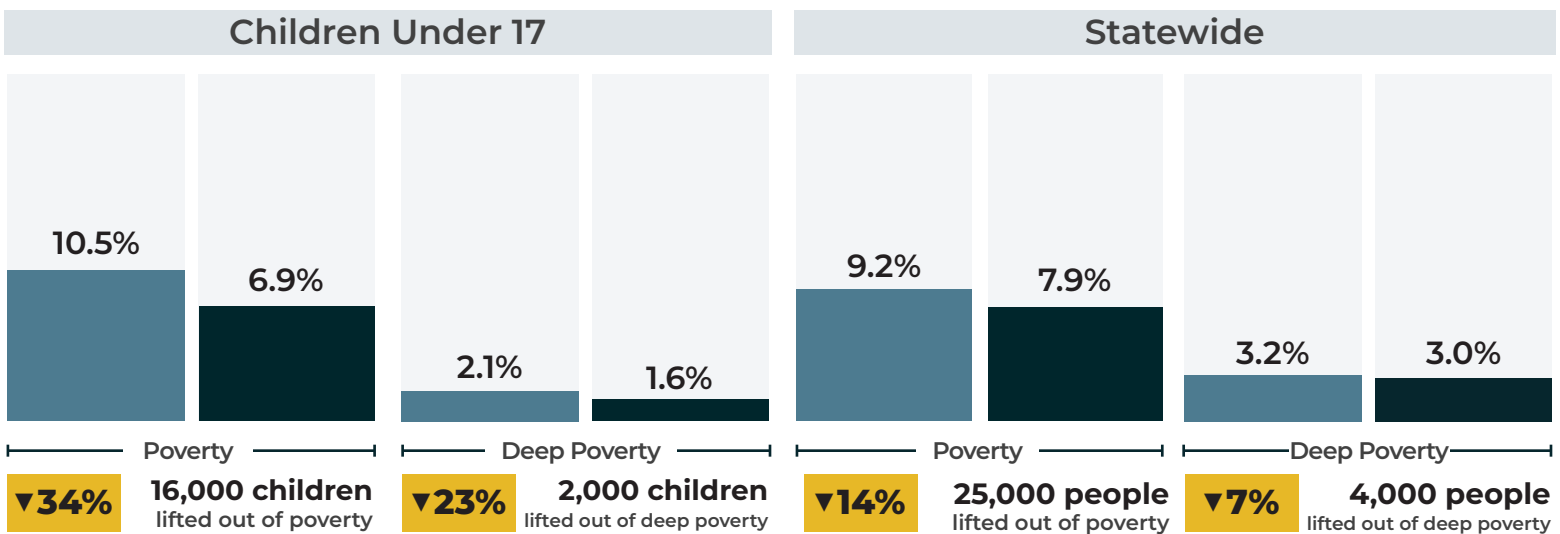
Child poverty reduced by **34%** ↓

Deep child poverty reduced by **23%** ↓

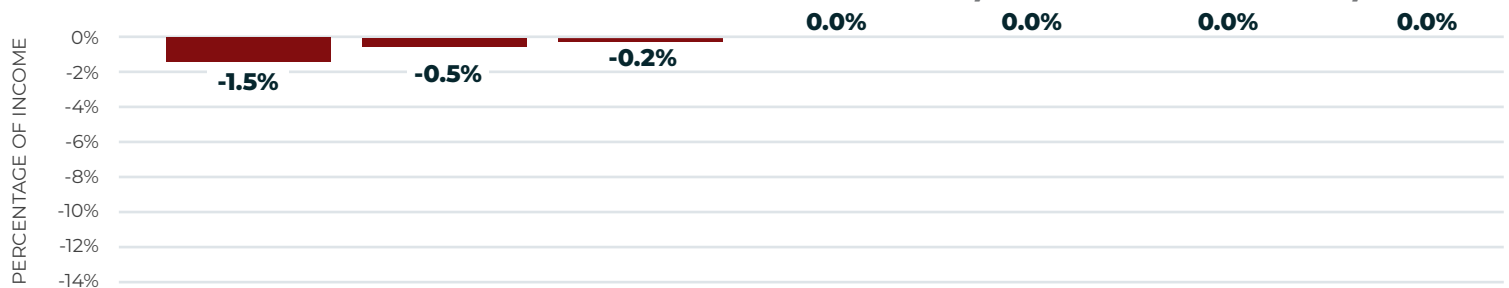

**67%** of Nebraska Children Under 17, (391,000)

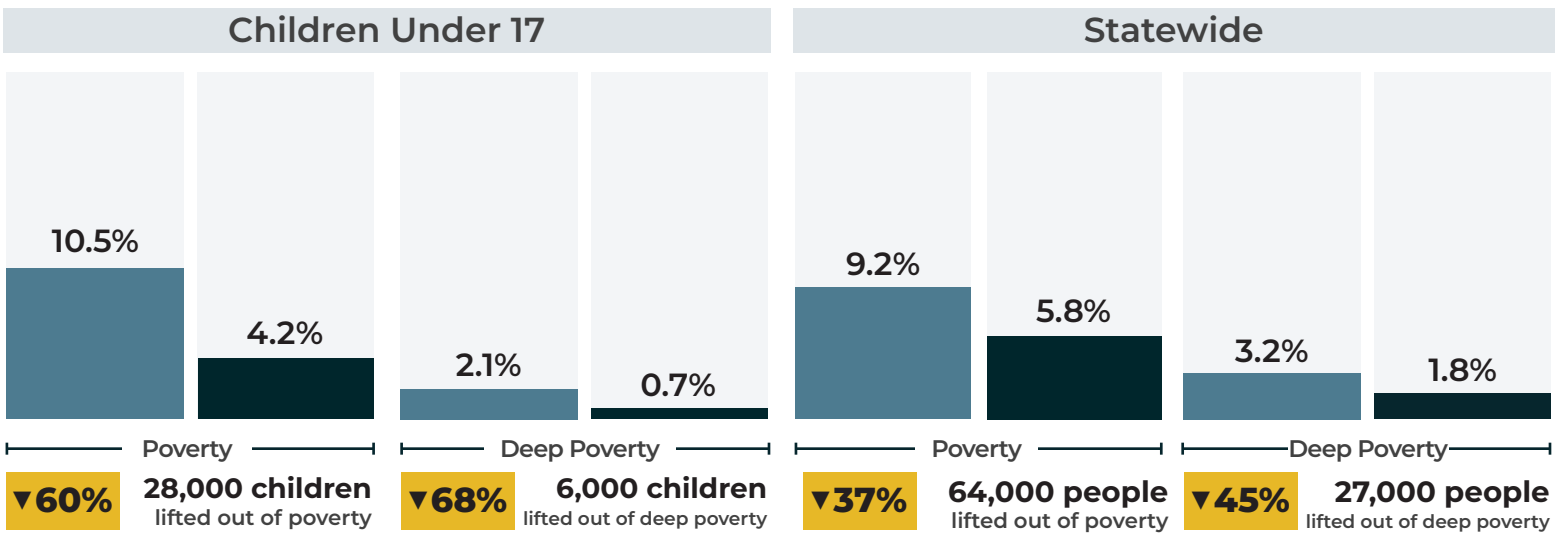
**27%** of Nebraska Adults, (356,000)

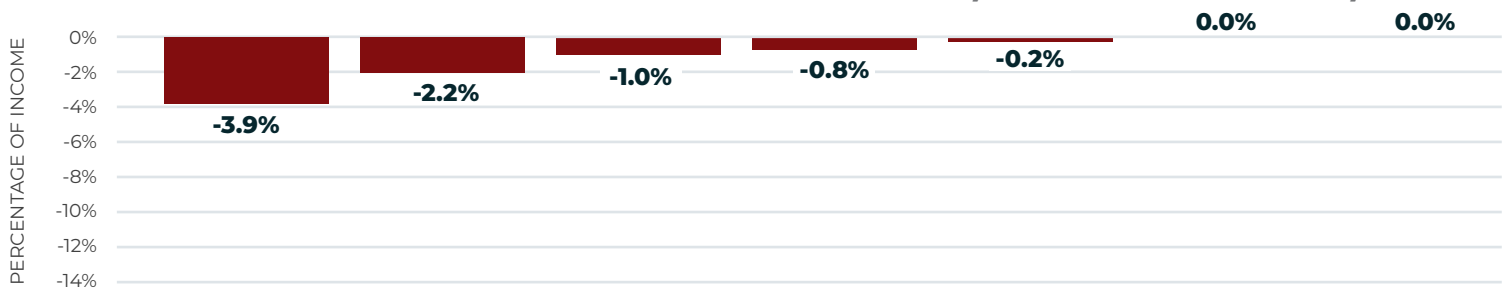
